Why have we received sports funding?

In April 2013, the Government announced a new funding £150 million per year for Physical Education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sports provision, allowing primary school teachers to carry on the sports legacy of the Olympics.

The funding was originally for the period of 1st September 2013- 31st August & September 2014 to August 2015. In February 2014, it was announced that the funding would be extended and would continue until 2020. Each year primary schools will continue to receive £8,000, plus £5 per pupil aged 5-11 years old.

This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas and to make an impact in Physical Education and Sport in School.

How will this funding help our children?

Schools are free to determine how the funding is used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. As well as promoting good health, the Government suggest that school sport has an important role in building 'self- confidence and a sense of achievement.

"Sport is so important because it encourages children to be active, lead a healthy lifestyle, make friends and, of course, have fun. But quality school sport has benefits that spread right across the curriculum and beyond - it develops confidence and a sense of achievement, it teaches young people how to rise to a challenge, and nurtures the character and skills that will help them get on and succeed in life." (David Cameron, 2014)

Sports presenter Clare Balding said that sport could also help academic results in school. 'As well as increasing fitness, it has been shown to help concentration as well as being a key factor in appreciating team work and a healthy lifestyle'.
